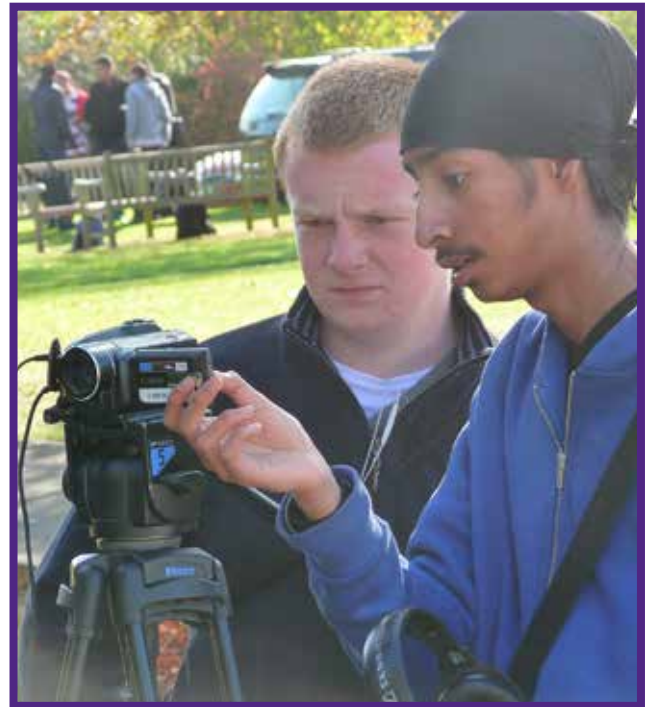


BTEC National Diploma Creative Digital Media Production (Film & Television Production)

(2 A level equivalent course)

Why study Film & Television Production?

- This course will help you develop a range of skills in areas related to Film and Television Production. You will learn to plan and research for media production, and will then produce your own scripts and films using digital technology
- You will follow units on areas such as single and multi-camera techniques, lighting, sound recording and editing to produce practical film and television projects.
- The course will help you develop the skills and knowledge required to progress onto study at university or further training

Course Outline

Assessment

There are four mandatory units, two externally assessed and two internally assessed. Learners must complete and achieve at Near Pass grade or above in all mandatory external units and achieve a Pass or above in all mandatory internal units. The externally-set and assessed units are completed in supervised conditions.

Special Entry Requirements

Standard BTEC Level 3 National Diploma entry requirements apply - www.solihullsfc.ac.uk/courses/entry-requirements. All students are encouraged to undertake two periods of vocational work experience (one in year 12 and the second in Year 13). A clear DBS 'Disclosure and Barring Service' may be needed depending on the nature of the placement. The cost of the DBS is approximately £60.00 and if it is needed then you are responsible for this payment (details of how to pay will be provided). It is not necessary to have taken Media Studies at GCSE in order to take this course.

A Level Media Studies.

What do our students go on to do?

This course is equivalent to 2 A levels. On completion of this qualification plus another A Level, you could progress to university to take either a Media Studies degrees or a degree in a particular area such as Film Production, Screenwriting or Web Design.

Work Placement

On this course you will be encouraged to undertake a work experience placement in both the first and the second year, the purpose of which is to gather information and insights about the workplace, which can be included in your College assignments. Work placements also help develop your employability skills.
