

BTEC Extended Certificate in IT

(Equivalent to 1 A level)

Why study IT?

- The BTEC Extended Certificate allows students to take a truly practical ICT course. The Extended Certificate is designed to continue the approach to learning that students have had at school, if they have studied ICT on a vocational programme.
- Students will experience a very 'hands on', practical course, with the ability to be creative using ICT skills, and to apply them in a range of contexts.
- This qualification is designed for learners who are interested in an introduction to the study of creating IT systems to manage and share information, alongside other fields of study, with a view to progressing to a wide range of higher education courses, not necessarily in IT.

Course Outline

A BTEC Extended Certificate is a 2-year vocational course, equivalent to one A level. It is normally studied alongside two other A level courses. Students will learn about the use and management of IT facilities in a variety of different work-related contexts.

Provisional Course Outline:

UNIT 1: INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY SYSTEMS (Externally Assessed)

You will study the role of computer systems and the implications of their use in personal and professional situations.

UNIT 2: CREATING SYSTEMS TO MANAGE INFORMATION (Externally Assessed)

You will study the design, creation, testing and evaluation of a relational database system to manage information.

UNIT 3: USING SOCIAL MEDIA IN BUSINESS

You will explore how businesses use social media to promote their products and services. You will also be given the opportunity to implement social media activities in a business to meet requirements.

UNIT 6: WEB DEVELOPMENT

You will investigate website development principles. You will be given the opportunity to design and develop a website using scripting languages.

Assessment

Equivalent in size to one A Level. 4 units of which 3 are mandatory and 2 are externally assessed.

Special Entry Requirements

If you have taken an IT course at GCSE you must have achieved at least grade 4, or at least merit in OCR Nationals or BTEC First Diplomas. This is in addition to standard A level entry requirements - see www.solihullsf.ac.uk/courses/entry-requirements.

What do our students go on to do?

BTEC Extended Certificates are recognised by both universities and employers as equivalent to one A level. It fully meets the requirements for progression to a degree course in IT and related areas such as: digital technology solutions, IT management for business, computer networks security or business computing and entrepreneurship.

Cost Implications

There will be an opportunity to go on fieldtrips. One recent fieldtrip saw students go to an IT seminar at Bletchley Park. The approximate cost was £30 per student.

Complementary Subjects or Enrichment Courses

Students on this course may be interested in a variety of enrichment options to add to their College experience. These include the Team Gambia volunteer project, becoming Charity Ambassador, joining the Gaming Society or being part of Student Council.
